

# Hunting bakkie hooks

Here is a simple but effective idea for the guys like me that travel and want to have sufficient hanging hooks when hunting BUT don't want them sticking out all the time.

Here I have my hooks on the back gate, **FACING INWARDS**, so when the gate is closed the hooks face inwards. A LOT SAFER! I also cover them with a hose to reduce any chance of injury. See the following photo as example of when the gate is closed.





The main thing is that these hooks can be removed totally from the cattle railings - if you do it that way it is a lot safer.



I have my hooks made up by Morne Steenkamp locally, he is a professional with welding and steel works, if you need a set of 5 hooks made up, give him a call, he charges a flat rate of R350-00 for 5 hooks.

I have them made with a thread and a wing nut, plus a stopper at the bottom, simply drill a hole in the rail, push the thread through and tighten the wing nut, can't be simpler than that.
