



Jackal Calling Secret

THIS IS A TIP THE PROFESSIONALS USE – TRY IT!!!!

Here is a scenario, and take note of this, the month is **March** (just before breeding season, Jackals are pairing up, looking for mates or have mates, March is a great month to hunt, April is also lekker, BUT March is great to target BOTH jackals at one stand. The MALE ; we use two calls as below illustrated, and placed correctly he will approach and 99% of time get wind wrong. The MALE ; we play a male jackal sound on the one caller, and also on the other call far apart, this lures in single females and also brings in local male jackals as they get peed off another male is close in his dominant area or gets cross as an intruder isnt wanted this time of year at all.

So, this targets the two jackals at one place and here is the scenario.

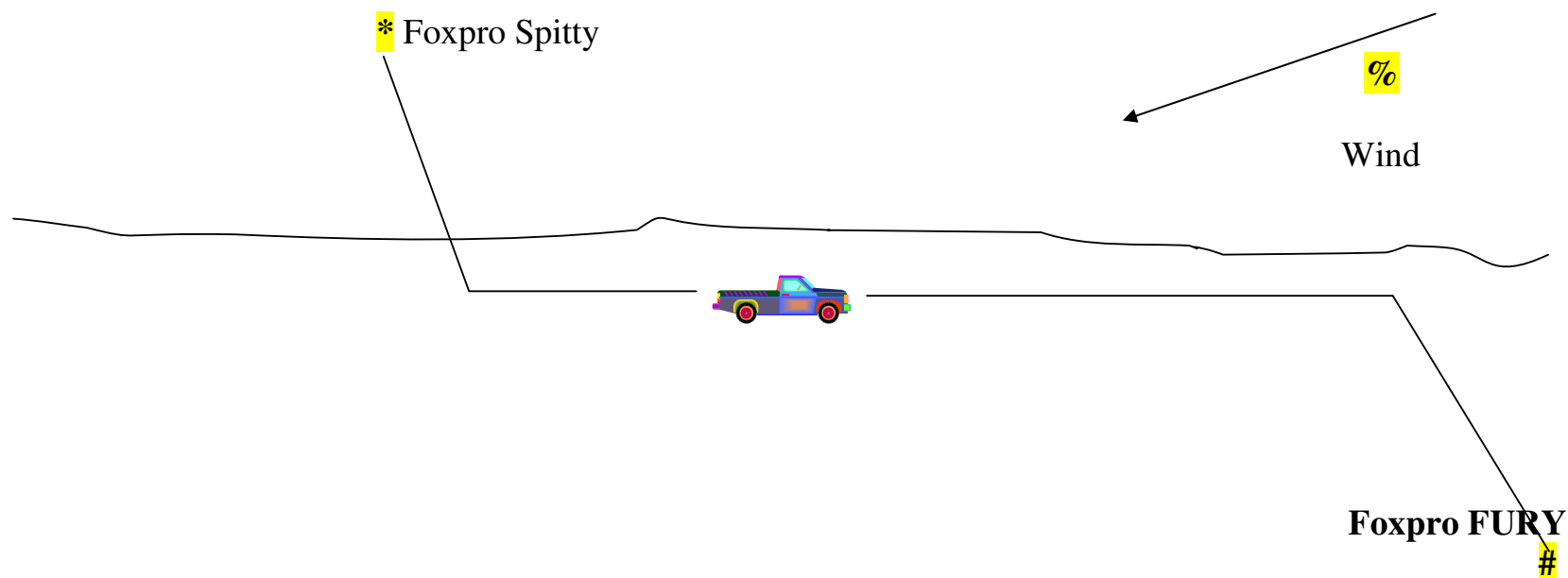
Work with the male bark, play two barks on the call into wind then play a bark on other call downwind, in reply to your first two barks, put off the calls, NEVER gooi over and over, its not real. Remember dogs are pack animals they respond to vocal barks, unlike cats. So – use this to kill him. Maak hom befok, tease him and make him mal! Gooi the male area call and then again on the other one. Put off and work more with the caller into the wind, try keep him away from downwind. Leave it off for a minute even two minutes, then gooi again with about 5-7 barks and once with call downwind. This will be now about 10 minutes we have called, if any local dogs male and female are close you will have shot by now, Give this 15 minutes and then if nothing. Wait 5 in quietness and then gooi a territorial bark and a fight to hot up the mood, these are good pointers to outwit the raskals!

When calling using two calls, its important to match the jackals yearly cycle as it changes monthly.

SEE BELOW FOR THE DRAWING

PULL BAKKIE OFF THE ROAD, FACE INTO THE WIND. I always mark out the 8-9 places to stand with the wind, then the last spot I turn, face the wind and call all the way back home into the wind.

- * Foxpro Spitfire **DOWNWIND 50m at 45 degrees and 50m into open field**
- # Foxpro FURY **INTO THE WIND, 70m at 45 degrees and 50m into open field**
- % Wind



Jackal going to have to be very clever to bypass both these two jackal barks to get downwind, and by doing this you give him other things to worry about before getting downwind LIKE, AGGRESSION because of another male, or a female will know other lonely males are close and this will take her attention from the wind factor.

GIVE THIS A TRY – March is a good month to call – fantastic in fact! As so much is going on in jackal world!!! Our last course in March 2010 we shot 12 jackal in two nights.
