

RED LIGHTS Vs NIGHT VISION

I have hunted predators for many years and in many years I have gone from *RED LIGHTS* to *NIGHT VISION* – and after spending many years in the outdoors I have learnt a lot of things and seen how these two different methods work and to see how far apart they are is mind blowing!

To the typical predator hunt who has called predators as Lynx he will know that cats come in slowly, low to the ground and are very cautious..... these are all cat facts, they look and blink slowly, and are elusive, yep, all facts.

BUT

That is because you are using red lights! You cannot compare using RED LIGHTS against using NIGHT VISION, they are so far apart you cannot even debate the differences, when I call cats, well lets look at my last 4 cats I called and shot, all these 4 cats did as follows;

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1. Ran into the caller location
 2. Came in close
 3. Did not look around in suspicion.
 4. All were totally relaxed
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It is a fact that by using night vision makes calling predators a lot easier than if you hunted them with a red light, that's a fact, and also your results will get better with kills as now you are using **ZERO lights**, cats are light shy and because now you use ZERO lights they respond more positively and far quicker.

After hunting for years I can tell that by using zero lights definitely helps you to kill more predators far more easily.
