

Jackal Calling CRASH COURSE!

I was asked to add a simple but not complicated addition to my site that just briefly mentions important aspects regarding calling predators. So..... Here we go! It is not easy but if you want blunt here is blunt.

I would say these selected pointers are vital for a successful night out - they work for me anyway.

If you do the calling thing properly you will get good results.



1. Hang a FRESH dead jackal behind your bakkie to hide your smell and also attract attention.
 2. Call with sequences and combo's
 3. Play food 5 seconds on and 30 seconds off.
 4. Create a story and bark every 20 minutes.
 5. Don't call too loudly
 6. Don't overcall
 7. Use two calls in the bush 200m apart (bark and food)
8. Rotate the light at least once every 20 seconds, NEVER longer!
 9. Use a dimmer
 10. Scan in a circle, back to the start on an 8 count
 11. Cover the truck well
12. Mark spots with wind, last spot turn and face wind & work back
13. Have patience at a stand - call at least an hour
14. Drive on windy nights, cats love wind
15. Use jackal gland lure in bottles downwind

16. Make sure to have open flat places with good ground



Don't always listen to the wind, not all jackals are clever!

Try use sounds nobody has used on the farm, if you call and after two places you get nothing MOVE out of that area.
